COVID vaccines: FDA adviser says vaccines could cause auto-immune disease

Dr. Paul Offit explains how spike proteins could be causing myocarditis.

Dr. Paul Offit Says There "Certainly is a Causal Link Between Vaccination & Myo/Pericarditis" "It may be the spike protein mimics one of the proteins on heart muscle cells...if that's true then...you're also inadvertently making immune response to your own heart muscle."

Dr. Paul Offit is the director of the Vaccine Education Center at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia and is also a member of the FDA's Vaccines and Related Biological Products Advisory Committee.

Here he discusses myocarditis, inflammation of the heart muscle, a side effect that has long been linked to the COVID vaccines, and suggests that the coronavirus' spike protein (which the vaccines prompt the body to churn out) could be causing the body to mount an immune response against its own heart.
