Russia-North Korea defense pact goes into effect

The landmark defense pact, signed this past June by their respective leaders, officially comes into effect following the exchange of ratification documents.

A landmark defense pact between North Korea and Russia, <u>signed this</u> <u>past June</u> by their respective leaders, has officially come into effect following the exchange of ratification documents, *AFP* reported on Wednesday, citing North Korea's state news agency *KCNA*.

The treaty's implementation comes amid accusations from the United States and South Korea that North Korea has deployed over 10,000 soldiers to support Russia in its war against Ukraine.

Experts suggest that North Korean leader Kim Jong Un is seeking to gain advanced technology and combat experience for his troops in return for this assistance.

The strategic partnership agreement was signed during Russian President Vladimir Putin's visit to Pyongyang and commits both nations to provide military aid "without delay" in the event of an attack on either country. It also solidifies their joint stance against Western sanctions.

The treaty went into effect on Wednesday, after the ratification documents were exchanged in Moscow by North Korean Vice Foreign Minister Kim Jong Gyu and his Russian counterpart, Andrei Rudenko, according to *KCNA*.

Last month, Russian lawmakers unanimously approved the agreement, which was later <u>signed into law</u> by Putin. In North Korea, the pact was ratified through a decree issued by Kim.

KCNA described the treaty as a "strong driving force accelerating the establishment of an independent and just multi-polarized world order without domination, subjugation and hegemony."

Since Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, military cooperation between Moscow and Pyongyang has deepened.

Both countries are subject to extensive UN sanctions — North Korea for its nuclear weapons program and Russia for its actions in Ukraine.

Russia in Continuous Attack on Norway

Russia reportedly has been using a northern Norway town to experiment with hybrid warfare and influence operations.

Since annexing Crimea in 2014, Moscow's military and intelligence services have been using Kirkenes, located six miles near the Russian border, as "a laboratory," a regional police chief told The New Yorker. Russian hackers have employed phishing scams, ransomware, and other forms of cyber warfare, and alleged tourists have been caught photographing sensitive defense and communications infrastructure.

Norway's domestic-intelligence service (PST) has warned of the threat of sabotage to the country's train lines, and to gas facilities that supply energy to much of Europe.

A few months ago, someone cut a vital communications cable running to a Norwegian Air Force base.

"We've seen what we believe to be continuous mapping of our critical infrastructure," regional counterintelligence chief Johan Roaldsnes, told The New Yorker. "I see it as continuous war preparation."

One journalist in Kirkenes told the outlet that Russia is using the Barents Sea for research and development of new delivery systems for nuclear weapons, "including a subsea nuclear torpedo that could flood a coastal city with a radioactive tsunami, and a nuclear-powered cruise missile with global reach."

"The Kola Peninsula is their strategic security against the West," Roaldsnes told The New Yorker. "The whole Russian plan is that, if things really heat up with NATO, they need to create a buffer," to preserve the capability to carry out nuclear strikes.

"That means the ability to control their closest neighboring territory ... and control access to the waters, to prevent anyone from getting close." European nations acknowledge that their people and infrastructure are under ceaseless attack from Russia. However, each incident falls below the threshold that would require a military response or trigger NATO's Article 5, which states that if one member is attacked, all other members will consider it an attack on all of them.

Every country that borders Russia is preparing for a wider war in the event of a Russian victory in Ukraine, The New Yorker reported.

CNN last week reported that Russia could wreak havoc with the United States' electronic infrastructure vast network of undersea fiber-optic cables carrying more than 95% of international data.

Two U.S. officials recently told the news outlet that Russia had increased military activity around the cables in the Baltic Sea near Denmark. Russia clearly sees itself at war with the West.

"That's for sure — we are saying that openly," the Russian U.N. representative recently said, The New Yorker reported.

Russians and proxies have used hybrid warfare, designed to subdue the enemy without fighting. They aim to subvert, sabotage, destabilize, and instill fear.

"They do it because they can do it," an air-traffic controller said of an electronic-warfare attack that imperils civilian aviation. "Then they deny everything, and they threaten you, saying that, if you don't stop accusing them of what you know they're doing, bad things will happen to you."

Russian volcano erupts sending ash 5 miles high after region suffers 7.0 magnitude earthquake

<u>Russia's Shiveluch volcano</u> spectacularly erupted after a 7.0-magnitude <u>earthquake</u> jolted the eastern coastline, the state-run TASS media outlet reported.

"According to visual evaluations, the ash column is rising as high as 8 kilometers (5 miles) above the sea level," declared TASS on Sunday morning local time, noting that the <u>volcano</u> spewed out lava flows.

"The volcano is approximately 280 miles from the coastal city of Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky. According to TASS, the Shiveluch volcano has not caused "major damage; nonetheless, "buildings are now being examined for potential damage, with special attention paid to social facilities." TASS indicated that no injuries were reported and did not issue a <u>tsunami</u> warning, though residents have been forced to evacuate the area after the <u>earthquake shook</u> the region.

The quake stirred significant alarm, prompting inhabitants to exit their dwellings. It is home to some 181,000 people within Russia's Kamchatka region. The tremors caused kitchenware to smash and furniture to 'topple,' South Asian News service ANI described.

The U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) identified the quake's epicenter as roughly 55 miles away from Petropavlovsk-Kamchatsky at a depth of about 30 miles. While Russia's agency said they did not announce a tsunami warning, earlier, the U.S. Tsunami Warning System did issue an alert stating, "hazardous tsunami waves from this earthquake are possible within 300km of the epicenter along the coasts of Russia."

According to <u>The Smithsonian</u>, Sheveluch (also spelled Shiveluch) in Kamchatka has had at least 60 large eruptions during the last 10,000 years. A broad 9km-wide caldera truncates the summit breached to the S, and many lava domes occur on the outer flanks.

The lava dome complex was constructed within the large open caldera. Frequent collapses of the dome complex have produced debris avalanches; the resulting deposits cover much of the caldera floor.

"A major south-flank collapse during a 1964 Plinian explosion produced a scarp in which a "Young Sheveluch" dome began to form in 1980. Repeated episodes of dome formation and destruction since then have produced major and minor ash plumes, pyroclastic flows, block-and-ash flows, and "whaleback domes" of spine-like extrusions in 1993 and 2020 (BGVN 45:11)" according to the Smithsonian Global Volcanism Program.

Multiple Active Shooters Target Air Force Base in San Antonio

Officials at Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland (JBSA) said its security officers returned fire on multiple active shooters who fired upon the main gate at the JBSA Chapman Training Annex early Saturday.

Southern Japan hit by M7.1 earthquake, tsunami warning issued

A strong earthquake hit off Japan's southern coast on Thursday evening, 8 August, prompting a tsunami advisory.

Authorities in areas of south and central Japan on the Pacific coast advised residents to avoid the coastline, though there were no immediate reports of injuries or significant damage.

The Japan Meteorological Agency in Tokyo reported that the quake, which occurred at 4:43 p.m. local time, had a magnitude of 7.1. It was centred in waters off the eastern coast of Kyushu, Japan's main southern island in the archipelago, at a depth of about 30 kilometres.

Nichinan city and surrounding areas in Miyazaki Prefecture on Kyushu experienced the strongest tremors.

The agency further said that a 50cm tsunami had already been seen along the southern coast of Kyushu and further east on the nearby island of Shikoku approximately half an hour after the earthquake.

Japan's Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshimasa Hayashi stated that officials were evaluating potential injuries or damage, but none were immediately reported. He urged residents in the affected region to remain away from the coast. Shigeki Aoki, an official from the Seismology Department was reported as cautioning that strong aftershocks could occur over the next week by the Associated Press.

NHK public television meanwhile carried stories of shattered windows at Miyazaki airport, not far from the earthquake's epicentre.

NHK also broadcast images of dozens of people gathering at a designated hilltop evacuation site; thousands who failed to act in a similar manner in the 2011 M9.0-9.1 Fukushima earthquake perished in the resulting tsunami in what was the largest earthquake in living memory to hit Japan.

Further south, in Osaki, Kagoshima prefecture, concrete walls collapsed, and a wooden house was damaged, but no injuries were reported.

The Nuclear Regulation Authority confirmed that all 12 nuclear reactors on Kyushu and Shikoku, including three currently operational, remained safe. Japan, like Taiwan, the Philippines and Indonesia in Asia, is located on the Pacific Ring of Fire and is prone to earthquakes due to its position along a series of seismic faults encircling the Pacific Ocean.

Russia Conducts Second Mobile Nuclear Missile Launcher Drill This Month

Russian forces are conducting drills involving Yars mobile nuclear missile launchers, Russian media reported Tuesday, in what would be the second such exercise in less than a month.

Missile launcher crews in the Volga river basin, some 700 kilometers (435 miles) east of Moscow, were set to move over 100 kilometers (62 miles) and practice camouflage and deployment, the Interfax news agency reported.

The drills follow similar exercises in early July in at least two different regions and are taking place less than two months after Russia held tactical nuclear weapons deployment exercises alongside ally Belarus

Iraq Eyes Drawdown of US-Led Forces Starting September, Sources Say

Iraq wants troops from a U.S.-led military coalition to begin withdrawing in September and to formally end the coalition's work by September 2025, four Iraqi sources said, with some U.S. forces likely to remain in a newly negotiated advisory capacity.

The Iraqi position is being discussed with U.S. officials in Washington this week at a security summit and there is no formal agreement on ending the coalition or any associated timetable yet, the Iraqi sources and U.S officials said.

U.S. State Department spokesperson Mathew Miller told a news briefing that both sides were meeting in Washington this week to determine how to transition the U.S.-led coalition's mission based on the threat posed by Islamic State, adding he had no further details.

PAKISTAN BOMBS AFGHANISTAN, CLAIMING TALIBAN IS 'ACTIVELY PATRONIZING' TERROR ACROSS BORDER

The government of Pakistan confirmed the execution of "intelligence-based anti-terrorist operations" within Afghanistan on Monday, outraging the Taliban, which claimed to have responded by bombing Pakistani military bases "with heavy weapons."

Report: China Expands Spy Sites in Cuba

China reportedly could be using an increased number of electronic surveillance stations in Cuba to spy on the U.S.

With Cuba less than 100 miles from Florida, four active sites could allow China to conduct electronic eavesdropping operations, according to a <u>Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS) report</u>.

Military bases and testing sites, not to mention space launch centers, are located in the southeast region of the U.S.

The Cuban sites also provide a highly strategic vantage point near Naval Station Guantanamo Bay, a key U.S. military base in the region.

"These four sites are among the most likely locations supporting China's efforts to spy on the United States," CSIS said.

The sites also "could also bolster China's use of telecommunications networks to spy on U.S. citizens," said Leland Lazarus, an expert on China-Latin America relations at Florida International University, The Wall Street Journal reported.

In its <u>2024 annual threat assessment</u>, the U.S. intelligence community said China is pursuing military facilities in Cuba, without providing details.

The sites mentions are located near Bejucal, in the hills overlooking the capital city of Havana; El Salao, under construction just east of the city of Santiago de Cuba; Wajay, about 6 miles north of Bejucal; and Calabazar, not far from Bejucal and Wajay. They all have the ability for signals intelligence (SIGINT), which can Intercept signals transmitted by both civilian and military actors.

"Collecting SIGINT is a complex task that requires specialized equipment, namely antennas, optimized for the signal characteristics of their targets," CSIS said.

The CSIS report said the Bejucal and Calabazar sites contain large dish antennas that appear designed to monitor and communicate with satellites, and could be useful for China's space program.

The report added China historically has lacked access to ground stations in North America, and accessing Cuban installations could help close that gap.

The Journal last year reported China and Cuba were negotiating <u>closer defense and intelligence ties</u>, and reached a secret agreement for Beijing to <u>establish an electronic eavesdropping facility</u> on the island.

During the Cold War, the Soviet Union operated its largest overseas site for electronic spying at Lourdes, just outside Havana, the Journal added.

In recent days, Southern California has experienced one earthquake after another. A 3.6 in Ojai on May 31. Two of a similar magnitude <u>under the East Los Angeles area of El Sereno</u>. Another three quakes <u>near Newport Beach and Costa Mesa</u>. While these quakes were far weaker than historic temblors like <u>the 6.7 Northridge Earthquake of 1994</u>, which caused an estimated \$20bn in damage and killed over

57 people, do they herald the arrival of the so-called Big One in a state sitting on multiple, highly active faultlines?

There's the notorious 800-mile-long <u>San Andreas</u>, which runs from near the Mexico border, east past Los Angeles, then up the coast north of Sacramento. Major quakes occur along the fault every 180 years or so, and the San Andreas hasn't had a majorly powerful one <u>since 1906</u>. The US Geological Survey <u>estimates</u> it has a 60 percent chance of causing a magnitude 6.7 or greater in the Los Angeles area in the next 30 years.

Of even greater concern is the Cascadia Subduction Zone, which runs from Northern California to British Columbia, Canada. It's <u>overdue for an even larger quake</u> compared with historical averages.

So, are the recent earthquakes an ominous omen of something larger, or business as usual in a state with an estimated 35 quakes a day?

U.S. deploys warships as Russian fleet makes close pass to Florida in approach to Cuba

The U.S. Navy has deployed warships and aircraft to track a Russian naval flotilla after the Russian vessels sailed less than 30 miles off South Florida's coast on Tuesday, U.S. officials told McClatchy and the Miami Herald.

Last week, Moscow sent <u>three ships and a nuclear-powered</u> <u>submarine</u> to the Caribbean for what U.S. officials say will be a set of extensive military air and naval exercises — the first of their kind in at least five years.

The drills began on Tuesday in the Atlantic, the Russian Defense Ministry said in a statement, with its hypersonic-capable frigate and nuclear-capable submarine simulating a strike on a group of enemy ships. It is unclear whether the

frigate is armed with hypersonic missiles, but the U.S. intelligence community has assessed that none of the Russian vessels are carrying nuclear weapons.

While the Biden administration has said it is not concerned by the Russian activity, it has nevertheless authorized the deployment of three powerful destroyers and a submarine reconnaissance aircraft to the region, a U.S. Northern Command official told McClatchy and the Herald on Tuesday. "In accordance with standard procedures, we've been actively monitoring the Russian ships as they transit the Atlantic Ocean within international waters," the NORTHCOM official said. "Air and maritime assets under U.S. Northern Command have conducted operations to ensure the defense of the United States and Canada. Russia's deployments are part of routine naval activity which pose no direct threat or concern to the United States."

The U.S. deployment includes three guided-missile destroyers — the USS Truxtun, USS Donald Cook and USS Delbert D. Black — as well as a Coast Guard cutter, the Stone, and a Boeing P-8 maritime patrol aircraft.

North Korea's Kim Hails Russia Ties as Putin Reportedly Plans Visit

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un hailed the country's expanding relationship with Russia on Wednesday, as reports suggest Russian President Vladimir Putin will soon visit the country for his third meeting with Kim.

Military, economic and other cooperation between North Korea and Russia have sharply increased since Kim visited Russia last September for a meeting with Putin. The U.S., South Korea and their partners believe North Korea has supplied artillery, missiles and other conventional weapons to Russia to support its war in Ukraine in return for advanced military technologies and economic aid.

Kim has been pushing to boost partnerships with Russia and China in a bid to strength his regional footing and launch a united front against the United States. During their September meeting at Russia's main space launch site, Kim invited the Russian president to visit North Korea at "a convenient time," and Putin accepted.

On Wednesday, Kim sent Putin a message congratulating Russia on its National Day, according to the North's official Korean Central News Agency.

"Thanks to the significant meeting between us at the Vostochney Spaceport in September last year, (North Korea)-Russia friendly and cooperative relations developed into an unbreakable relationship of comrades-in-arms," Kim said in the message.

Kim's comments came as media reports said Putin is expected to visit North Korea as early as next week. If realized, it would their third summit meeting. Their first summit happened in Vladivostok in April 2019.

Japanese public broadcaster NHK, citing unidentified diplomatic sources including high-ranking Russian officials, reported Wednesday that Putin is preparing to visit North Korea and Vietnam next week.

NHK said Putin is expected to seek stronger military ties with North Korea as Russia faces a shortage of weapons in its war with Ukraine, while North Korea is believed to want help with space technology in the wake of its recent failure to put a second spy satellite in orbit in late May.

Russian business daily Vedomosti, citing an unidentified diplomatic source, said Monday that Putin will visit North Korea and Vietnam "in the coming weeks." The report quoted Russia's ambassador in North Korea, Alexander Matsegora, as saying that preparations for Putin's visit to North Korea were underway.

NATO Allies' Support Grows for Strikes in Russia

Germany said it had given Ukraine permission to fire German-delivered weapons at targets in Russia, a day after U.S. officials said Washington had partially lifted similar restrictions to allow Ukraine to defend its eastern Kharkiv region, which borders Russia.

Kyiv has the "right under international law to defend itself" against attacks coming from inside Russia, close to the border with Ukraine, German Chancellor Olaf Scholz's spokesman Steffen Hebestreit said.

The Sun's Magnetic Poles Are Reversing: What Happens if a Solar Storm Strikes Earth?

According to scientists, every 11 years, the sun goes through a cycle where its magnetic poles (North and South) reverse or switch places.

The sun's poles last flipped in 2013, so the next event is on schedule to take place this year, according to Vox.com.

Scientists say there's no need to panic. It's not a sign of the apocalypse. You won't even notice it when the flip happens. But it's not the pole reversal itself that's the main cause for concern.

With the sun's surface growing more active, serious anomalies can happen. While that's great news for amateur astronomers who are set to see some amazing solar fireworks through their telescopes, it could be bad news for power grids and communication satellites circling the Earth.

There's already intense magnetic activity now happening on the sun's surface that marks a kind of lead-in that comes before the poles' reversal.

"We are indeed seeing the sun more active than it's been in probably something like 20 years," Paul Charbonneau, a solar physicist at the University of Montreal, told Vox. It's during these peak periods of solar activity that the sun's fireworks grow larger. "When the magnetic energy content of the sun is a lot larger, that's when you tend to get more solar flares, more {coronal} mass ejections — more fun stuff," Charbonneau said.

It's these Coronal Mass Ejections (CME) that hurl charged matter out across the solar system like a giant shotgun, resulting in a potentially disruptive solar storm.

Grid Operators Have Been Watching

As CBN News reported in December 2021, grid operators in some regions of the country have been heeding warnings to prepare for solar storms and sunspots blasting particles into space.

William Murtagh's group at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) maintains a direct line with all the electric companies in the event of a geomagnetic eruption.

"When we see one of these large eruptions occurring in the sun, what we call Coronal Mass Ejection, coming towards Earth, we initiate this hotline call and we make communication with essentially the entire grid, owners and operators across the nation," Murtagh, who serves as program coordinator at NOAA's Space Weather Prediction Center, told CBN News.

Researchers with the U.S. Geological Survey released a map in 2020 showing grid systems in the Midwest and Eastern Seaboard that are particularly vulnerable to solar storms.

Murtagh says electricity operators are now constantly assessing areas of vulnerability. "If there's vulnerability in certain equipment, maybe they can modify that equipment, the manufacturing of that equipment, to make it hardened, to make it better protected against a geomagnetic storm," Murtagh said. "There are many different actions they can take to ensure that the grid stays up and running during these big geomagnetic storms." On July 23, 2012, an eruption on the Sun sent giant particle clouds hurtling through space at 6.7 million miles per hour, missing Earth but passing straight through a satellite in its path. Scientists say that extreme solar storm is believed to have been the most powerful in at least 150 years.

Dr. Doug Biesecker is a solar physicist with NOAA's Space Weather Prediction Center. He said what keeps him up at night about space weather is missing the forecast of the one in a 100-year surface storm on the sun.

"The sort of storm that would cause a widespread power outage. You know you could imagine maybe the entire Northeast losing power for at least a few hours if not for a day or more," Biesecker said.

The Largest Solar Storm on Record Struck Our Planet in 1859

In 1859, one of these solar eruptions hit Earth. Now known as the "Carrington Event," it's the largest geomagnetic storm on record.

The technology of the day was the telegraph, and telegraph operators were able to disconnect their batteries and use the electricity caused by the solar storm to run their systems. But it also caused fires at some telegraph stations.

That storm had such an impact on Earth that the so-called Northern Lights could be seen from the equator.

Analysts say a direct hit by an extreme CME like the one in July 2012 could be catastrophic, leading to widespread power blackouts.

A study by the National Academy of Sciences reported the total economic impact could be more than \$2 trillion -- 20 times greater than the cost of Hurricane Katrina. In today's technology-driven world, the solar superstorm could have done serious damage to homes on Earth and continued traveling up into space.

It could have disrupted spacecraft, satellite communications, GPS, airplane flights, and the power grid, which could have knocked out power to everything from businesses to houses.

"Without the electric grid, well, of course, there's no power. There's also no water; there's also no communications, no transportation, no medical care," Dr. Avi Schnurr, CEO and president of the Electric Infrastructure Security Council explained.

"The financial system would be down," he continued. "The environmental effects would be catastrophic at a level that we've never seen before."

In addition, it could take years to repair multi-ton transformers.

Comparing the 2012 solar storm to the blast from the sun in 1859, University of Colorado scientist Daniel Baker said, "The only difference is, it missed."

Opportunity to Study, Better Understand Our Star

But scientists see opportunity during this time of heightened solar activity. They want to study the sun to learn how to better predict space weather, according to Vox. Predicting weather in space, like meteorologists do on the earth, would lead to safer space travel. NASA has targeted September 2025 for Artemis II, the first crewed Artemis mission around the Moon, and September 2026 for Artemis III, which is planned to land the first astronauts near the lunar South Pole.

Artemis IV, the first mission to the Gateway lunar space station, remains on track for 2028.

The next goal will be sending humans to Mars

Chinese media warning about 'World War' with NATO countries

Charge Western alliance pushing public to support expansion of Russia-Ukraine conflict

An editorial from the propaganda department of the Chinese Communist Party is openly speculating, even warning, about a coming "World War" with NATO.

It was a piece called, "NATO is pushing the Russia-Ukraine conflict toward a 'world war,'" that was published in the Global Times, an English-language publication run by the Chinese Communists.

The commentary cited comments by NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg during a recent visit to the U.S. about NATO's "readiness."

According to a report from Newsweek, that article said the Russia-Ukraine conflict could grow into a "world war."

The report said tensions have been high between Russia and NATO, especially after NATO last month announced its largest ever military exercise, called "Steadfast Defender 2024."

Those events started late last month and are scheduled to run through May, and they are supposed to involve some 90,000 members of militaries from 31 NATO nations, plus Sweden.

Being "tested," the report said, is the allies' ability to move forces quickly and stage defense procedures.

The report said, "Military analysts have speculated Steadfast Defender is meant to prepare alliance members for the potential of a future Russian invasion on NATO territory."

While the announcement of the plan did not mention Russia, the regime of Vladimir Putin is viewed as a major security threat to NATO.

The propaganda piece charged that the NATO chief's visit "is not just about NATO seeking funds."

It continued, "This is a clear preparation of public opinion to expand the Russia-Ukraine conflict into a world war."

The propaganda continued, "This strategic adjustment by NATO may enhance its internal cohesion in the short term and continue to maintain its position as the world's most powerful military force held by the U.S. and the West. However, in the long term, it may lead to more divisions and confrontations globally, profoundly affecting international relations and the security environment around China."

Newsweek said it sought comment from NATO and the Russian foreign ministry.

The editorial comes only shortly after Russia's former president, Dmitry Medvedev, said on social media that there was a potential for a "big war" with NATO> He called those who organized the NATO alliance's exercise as "Western politicians who have s--- their pants and their mediocre generals in NATO."

Two sets of earthquake swarms have hit California. What's going on along the Mexico border?

Another earthquake swarm has been rumbling along the California-Mexico border.

More than two dozen quakes greater than magnitude 2.5 have occurred since just after midnight Saturday, with epicenters about 175 miles southeast of downtown Los Angeles and 100 miles northeast of San Diego, according to the U.S. Geological Survey.

They have occurred largely along farmland between the towns of Brawley and Imperial in Imperial County. The largest quake was a <u>magnitude 3.9</u> that struck at 4:05 p.m. Saturday, bringing light shaking to the Imperial Valley as well as south of the border and rattling Mexicali.

An even larger earthquake — a <u>magnitude 4.1</u> — occurred at 5:17 a.m. Monday about 28 miles northwest of the swarm that began Saturday.

The epicenter of that quake was in a remote desert area east of Anza-Borrego Desert State Park, and weak shaking was felt as far away as San Diego, parts of Orange County, Temecula, the Coachella Valley, El Centro and Holtville.

A separate swarm of earthquakes occurred a week ago, about 40 miles southeast of the most recent quake activity. Last week's swarm occurred about 18 miles southeast of Mexicali in Baja California, with the largest a magnitude 4.2 that was felt as far away as El Centro in California and Yuma, Ariz.

Earthquake swarms are <u>common</u> in the Imperial Valley. Swarms have happened <u>many times</u> in this part of California without being followed by a major, damaging earthquake.

Nonetheless, scientists typically pay close attention to the area, where there are many faults. And there have been moments of greater concern in recent years.

In 2016, as an earthquake swarm topped out with a magnitude 4.3 quake in a different part of the region — directly beneath the Salton Sea, just south of where the mighty San Andreas fault ends — scientists issued a rare warning advising of an elevated risk for a big San Andreas fault earthquake.

That series of quakes was <u>concerning</u> "because that 2016 swarm was so close to the known San Andreas fault, which has been building up a lot of stress over the past 300 years," said Clara Yoon, a seismologist with the USGS' Pasadena office. But this last weekend's earthquake swarm occurred farther south, away from the San Andreas, Yoon said.

The southern San Andreas fault — which stretches from the Salton Sea through Los Angeles County to Monterey County — is capable of rupturing in a magnitude 8.2 earthquake. The last megaquake to occur on that fault was in 1857, when an estimated magnitude 7.8 earthquake hit between Monterey County and the Cajon Pass in San Bernardino County. In 2020, another swarm of quakes close to the Mexican border attracted attention and would have been more concerning had it started moving closer to the San Andreas fault.

The Imperial Valley region was particularly active with earthquakes in the late 1970s and 1980s.

Two of the bigger quakes in historic time in the area — a magnitude <u>6.9 earthquake in 1940</u> and a magnitude <u>6.4 quake in the Imperial Valley in 1979</u> — came without any preceding swarms, seismologist Lucy Jones has said. The 1979 earthquake caused <u>\$30 million in damage</u>, injured 91 people and damaged more than 1,500 homes and over 400 commercial buildings.

More significant earthquakes occurred in the area in 1987. The magnitude 6.6 Superstition Hills quake, which followed a magnitude 6.2 temblor on a nearby fault that struck 11 hours earlier, caused \$4 million in damage and injured 94 people in Imperial County and left 3,000 people temporarily homeless in the Mexicali area.

South of the California-Mexico border, a magnitude <u>7.2</u> earthquake struck on Easter Sunday in 2010, killing two people in Mexicali and damaging buildings on both sides of the border.

Pentagon: Russia Put Weapon Into Space on May 16

Russia last week launched a satellite that U.S. intelligence officials believe to be a weapon capable of inspecting and attacking other satellites, the U.S. Space Command said on Tuesday as the Russian spacecraft trails a U.S. spy satellite in orbit. Russia's Soyuz rocket blasted off from its Plesetsk launch site some 500 miles north of Moscow on May 16, deploying in low-Earth orbit at least nine satellites including COSMOS 2576, a type of Russian military "inspector" spacecraft U.S. officials have long condemned as exhibiting reckless space behavior.

"We have observed nominal activity and assess it is likely a counterspace weapon presumably capable of attacking other satellites in low Earth orbit," a USSPACECOM spokesperson said in a statement to Reuters.

Houston metro rocked by 100 mph derecho that left 7 dead and over 1 million without power

A storm system spawned severe thunderstorms in Houston Thursday, causing at least four fatalities and leaving more than 1 million customers without power across southeastern Texas.

A line of severe thunderstorms swept through southeastern Texas and Louisiana on Thursday, blasting the <u>Houston</u> area with incredible winds reaching up to 100 mph that left at least seven dead - including a mother of a newborn - and more than 1 million power customers without electricity.

The extreme wind gusts blew out windows of high-rise buildings and caused transmission towers holding power lines to crumble.

The National Weather Service in Houston called the event a <u>derecho</u>, which produces destructive winds over hundreds of miles and impacts millions of people.

Russia said Monday it will hold drills simulating the use of battlefield nuclear weapons amid rising tensions after comments by senior Western officials about the possibility of deeper involvement in the war in Ukraine.

The announcement came on the eve of Russian President Vladimir Putin's inauguration to a fifth term in office and in a week when Moscow on Thursday will celebrate Victory Day, its most important secular holiday, marking its defeat of Nazi Germany in World War II.

The drills are a response to "provocative statements and threats of certain Western officials regarding the Russian Federation," the Defense Ministry said in a statement.

China Confronts Japanese Politicians in Disputed E. China Sea Area

Minor damages reported after 6.6 magnitude earthquake hits Japan

April 17 (UPI) -- A 6.6 magnitude earthquake hit Japan at 11:14 p.m. Wednesday local time, off the west coast of Shikoku Island.

<u>Initial reports</u> said there was no threat of tsunami and only minor injuries and damage reported.

The quake's epicenter, where the 6.6 magnitude was recorded, was in a strait called the Bungo-Suido Channel between Kyushu and Shikoku Islands.

G7 Leaders Convene Via Video Call on Response to Iran

Italy, which holds the rotating presidency of the G7, has called a video meeting of G7 leaders Sunday to discuss Iran's attack on Israel late Saturday.

The Iranian attack in response to a suspected Israeli air strike on Iran's embassy compound in Damascus on April 1 has raised the threat of a wider regional conflict. "We express our deep concern about a further destablisation of the situation in the region and continue to work to avoid that," Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni said on social media platform X.

The G7 call will be held in the early afternoon European time, an Italian government statement said.

President Joe Biden has pledged a coordinated G7 diplomatic response to the drone and missile attack, which he condemned, and Italian Foreign Minister Antonio Tajani said he hoped that the Israeli government shows restraint in its response.

"I hope that the Israeli government will adopt a cautious line. I hope that there will be no counterattack to the counterattack," Tajani told radio station RTL 102.5.

The G7 groups the United States, Canada, Italy, Britain, France, Germany and Japan. Its foreign ministers are scheduled to meet over April 17-19 on the Italian island of Capri.

Sunday, 7:10 p.m.: The G-7 condemned the "Iran's unprecedented attack" and called on both sides to use restraint.

Bloomberg reported that the leaders agreed to use all channels to urge Israel not to launch a counter-offensive against Iran.

Sunday, 6:55 p.m.: UK Foreign Secretary David Cameron formally condemned, "in the strongest terms," Iran's attack on Israel in a call with Iranian Foreign Minister Amir Abdollahian.

"I made clear that Iran must stop these reckless attacks, de-escalate, and release the MSC Aries," Cameron noted.

Sunday, 6:47 p.m.: Former US Ambassador to the UN Nikki Haley condemned calls for Israel to show restraint following the attack by Iran: "Just like after October 7, the world supports Israel when she gets hit but is quick to condemn her when Israel hits back. That's wrong. No other country would be expected to do nothing in response to 300 missiles launched against its territory."

Sunday, 6:09 p.m.: The IDF has announced that following a situational assessment, the Home Front Command's defensive guidelines remain

unchanged and in effect up until tomorrow, Monday, 15.04.2024, at 23:00 Israel time.

Sunday, 6:00 p.m: A White House official has confirmed to *Reuters* that US President Joe Biden has told Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu that the United States would not participate in any Israeli counter-offensive against Iran.

Sunday, 4:34 p.m.: The War Cabinet has convened to discuss the Iranian attack.

Sunday, 4:28 p.m.: Irish Minister for Foreign Affairs Micheál Martin condemned the Iranian attack against Israel and called for de-escalation. "I strongly condemn Iran's attack on Israel. My thoughts are with the Israeli people at this time. The scale and intensity of the attack represents a flagrant threat to international peace and security and is utterly unacceptable. It does nothing to help the cause of the Palestinian people or bring us closer to an end to the suffering in Gaza.

"There is now an urgent need for regional de-escalation. Further escalation is in nobody's interest. I urge all actors to intensify efforts to restore stability. Ireland will work closely with our EU partners in responding to this crisis."

Sunday, 4:22 p.m. UK Defense Secretary Grant Shapps summed up his country's efforts to repel the Iranian attack against Israel: "Last night the UK intercepted and destroyed multiple one-way attack drones - launched by Iran and its proxies - that posed a threat to civilian lives in the Middle East.

"Additional Royal Air Force aircraft were deployed this weekend to bolster our presence. I thank our armed forces personnel for responding so quickly and effectively to such a serious threat. Their professionalism is second to none. All aircraft returned safely to base."

Sunday, 4:15 p.m.: The Turkish Minister of Foreign Affairs phoned his Iranian counterpart following the Iranian attack against Israel and told him that Turkey does not want an additional escalation in the region, *Kan News* reported. He stated that Turkey wishes to end steps that would intensify the tensions in the region. The Iranian Foreign Minister answered that his country's retribution against Israel had ended.

Sunday, 3:24 p.m.: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy condemned the Iranian attack against Israel, stating: "Ukraine condemns Iran's attack on Israel using 'Shahed' drones and missiles. We in Ukraine know very well the horror of similar attacks by Russia, which uses the same 'Shahed' drones and Russian missiles, the same tactics of mass air strikes. "Every effort must be made to prevent a further escalation in the Middle East. Iran's actions threaten the entire region and the world, just as Russia's actions threaten a larger conflict, and the obvious collaboration between the two regimes in spreading terror must face a resolute and united response from the world.

"The sound of 'Shahed' drones, a tool of terror, is the same in the skies over the Middle East and Europe. This sound must serve as a wake-up call to the free world, demonstrating that only our unity and resoluteness can save lives and prevent the spread of terror worldwide.

"The world cannot wait for discussions to go on. Words do not stop drones and do not intercept missiles. Only tangible assistance does. The assistance we are anticipating. We must strengthen security and resolutely counter all those who want to make terror a new normal. "It is critical that the United States Congress make the necessary decisions to strengthen America's allies at this critical time."

Sunday, 1:10 p.m.: The Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Tehran summoned the ambassadors of Great Britain, France and Germany, apparently due to the countries' condemnation of the Iranian attack on Israel.

Sunday, 12:40 p.m.: The Russian government claimed that Iran acted properly in its overnight attack on Israel and did so in "strict accordance" with the right to self-defense under the rules of the UN.

Sunday, 9:47 a.m.: The Chief of Staff of the Iranian military, Major General Mohammad Bagheri, threatened an even larger attack if Israel retaliates following last night's massive drone and missile attack against the Jewish State.

"Our response will be much larger than tonight's military action if Israel retaliates against Iran," Bagheri said, adding a threat against the US if America supports Israel's retaliation.

Sunday, 9:08 a.m.: President Isaac Herzog wrote on X: "Bless you dear soldiers and commanders of the IDF and IAF."

"Bless the coalition of nations led by the US and @POTUS.

"Bless my sisters and brothers, the people of Israel, for their exceptional show of resilience.

"Together, the forces of good will overcome the forces of evil. 'Am Yisrael Chai!"

Sunday, 8:38 a.m.: The Israel Aviation Authority announced the reopening of Ben Gurion Airport following the Iranian attack on Israel overnight.

"In accordance with the instructions of the security authorities, the airspace has opened, and Ben Gurion Airport has resumed operations starting at 7:30 a.m. The flight schedule from Ben Gurion Airport is expected to change. Passengers are requested to check with the airlines and on the Israel Airports Authority website for the new flight time tabe before arriving at the Ben Gurion airport. Domestic airports will open during the day. We will continue to update as the situation develops," the IAA announced.

Sunday, 6:47 a.m.: The IDF Spokesperson's Unit said that, a short while ago, IDF fighter jets struck a number of military structures in a complex belonging to Hezbollah's Radwan Forces in the area of Jbaa in southern Lebanon.

Russia and China are on the brink of a military alliance that could overwhelm the US

For decades, the military might of the US was unchallenged. After the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991, the US was the world's only military superpower, with its forces deployed all over the world to defend allies and deter aggression.

But as 2023 draws to a close, conflicts are flaring across the world, and Russia and China are growing increasingly aggressive in their shared ambition to topple the US as the world's biggest power. Their authoritarian leaders, Xi Jinping of China and Vladimir Putin of Russia, are seeking to exploit global instability to damage the US and its allies, say analysts, and are drawing closer to forming a military alliance that poses the biggest threat the US has faced in decades.

Blinken to Gallant: The US will stand with Israel against any threats by Iran

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken spoke with Defense Minister Yoav Gallant on Wednesday and reiterated US support for Israel's security. In a statement following the call, State Department spokesperson Matthew Miller said that Blinken made clear to Gallant "that the US will stand with Israel against any threats by Iran and its proxies." "Secretary Blinken and Minister Gallant also discussed ongoing efforts to

"Secretary Blinken and Minister Gallant also discussed ongoing efforts to secure the release of all hostages through an agreement for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza," said the statement.

"Secretary Blinken welcomed Israel's recent announcements of urgent steps to facilitate the entry of humanitarian assistance into Gaza and to improve humanitarian deconfliction and coordination, reiterating that incidents such as the strike on World Central Kitchen workers must never reoccur," Miller added.

Blinken also "emphasized that the United States expects Israel to quickly implement its commitments on humanitarian assistance and deconfliction and that those commitments must be sustained over time."

The conversation between the two took place amid speculations that <u>Iran</u> <u>is planning</u> to attack Israel in response to <u>an attack in Syria</u> last week that killed a top Iranian general.

Axios reported on Wednesday that the commander of the US military central command (CENTCOM), Gen. Erik Kurilla, will visit Israel on Thursday to coordinate around a possible attack on Israel by Iran and its proxies.

Iran's Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, said on Wednesday that Israel made a mistake by attacking the Iranian consulate in Damascus and killing the general.

"Israel must be punished and they will pay for their mistakes," he said. *CBS News* reported last week that the US has picked up intelligence on what an Iranian retaliatory strike might look like.

Netanyahu's warning to Iran

PM addresses growing threats by Iran during cabinet meeting, says 'whoever attempts to harm us will be harmed.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu delivered a warning to Iran amidst increased threats from the Islamic Republic.

"For years Iran has been working against us both directly and through its proxies, and therefore Israel has been working against Iran and its emissaries, both defensively and offensively," Netanyahu said during the ongoing security cabinet meeting this evening (Thursday).

"We will know how to protect ourselves and we will act according to the simple principle that whoever hurts us or plans to harm us, we will harm them," the prime minister said.

Kan News reported that several Israeli embassies abroad were evacuated after a situational assessment by the Shin Bet and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the possibility of an Iranian revenge plot following the assassination of a senior member of the Iranian Revolutionary Guards, Hassan Mahdavi, in Damascus this week. Some of the Israeli representatives were moved to alternative locations and asked not to attend public events at this stage.

At the same time, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs ordered some of Israel's embassies in the world not to open their doors tomorrow. The representatives were instructed not to go to the embassies and consulates and to stay in their homes.

Strongest earthquake in 25 years rocks Taiwan, killing 9 people and stranding 70 workers in quarries

HUALIEN, Taiwan (AP) — The <u>strongest earthquake</u> in a quarter-century rocked Taiwan during the morning rush hour Wednesday, killing nine people, stranding dozens of workers at quarries and sending some residents scrambling out the windows of damaged buildings.

The quake, which also injured more than 1,000, was centered off the coast of rural, mountainous Hualien County, where some buildings leaned at severe angles, their ground floors crushed. Just over 150 kilometers (93 miles) away in the capital of Taipei, tiles fell from older buildings, and schools evacuated their students to sports fields, equipping them with yellow safety helmets. Some children covered themselves with textbooks to guard against falling objects as aftershocks continued.

Rescuers fanned out in Hualien, looking for people who may be trapped and using excavators to stabilize damaged buildings. The numbers of people missing, trapped or stranded fluctuated frequently as authorities learned of more in trouble and worked to locate or free them.

Taiwan sounds alarm as 20 Chinese fighter jets and eight warships circle island

China has deployed more than 20 fighter jets and eight warships

towards <u>Taiwan</u>, the self-ruled island's defense ministry announced on Wednesday.

The <u>Chinese People's Liberation Army</u> sent 20 military aircraft and eight navy vessels around Taiwan in a 24-hour-window leading up to 6am local time Wednesday, Taiwan's Ministry of National Defense said.

US Ally Scrambles Jets To Intercept Chinese Spy Drone

The Japanese Defense Ministry said it scrambled fighter jets on Tuesday to

intercept a Chinese unmanned aerial vehicle in the Sea of Japan, in what was the first known operation in the area by China's long-range spy drone.

A *Newsweek* map, recreated using data released by the Joint Staff of <u>Japan</u>'s Self-Defense Forces, shows the flight path of the WZ-7 reconnaissance UAV, which Tokyo said was detected in the waters on the morning of March 26.

The Chinese military drone entered the Sea of Japan—known in both Koreas as the East Sea—via the continental area and later returned in a northwesterly direction following a <u>circular patrol</u>, the report said, suggesting the sortie most likely overflew the territory of North Korea or Russia, which both border the sea.

The planet was just slammed with what government officials dubbed a severe geomagnetic storm, the second-highest level of NOAA's rating system. The event brought "a major disturbance in Earth's magnetic field" that may have impacted infrastructure and made the northern lights visible farther than usual, officials said.

NOAA's Space Weather Prediction Center issued a <u>geomagnetic storm</u> <u>watch</u> on Saturday, saying that a coronal mass ejection was detected and expected to hit the planet late that same day with impacts into Monday. <u>Coronal mass ejections</u>, or CMEs, are when a large cloud of plasma and magnetic field bursts from the sun's corona.

This particular CME exploded alongside a solar flare on Friday, an event that occurs when electromagnetic radiation suddenly erupts from the sun. NOAA says these flares can last hours and the eruption "travels at

the speed of light," meaning it can impact Earth as soon as it is observed. An X-class flare, like what was observed with the CME, is the strongest type of flare, although this particular one was not the strongest on record. NOAA forecasters did say, however, that more X-class flares are possible through Wednesday.

"The public should not be concerned, but may wish to keep informed by visiting our webpage for any forecast changes and updates," NOAA said on Saturday, saying a moderate geomagnetic storm was possible. By Sunday afternoon, however, the agency alerted of a "severe" storm that could potentially impact technology – and eventually extend the northern lights as far south as Alabama.

China Told It Faces 'Fork in the Road' as Officials Meet CEOs

China needs to "reinvent itself" with economic policies to speed resolution of its property market crisis and boost domestic consumption and productivity, the International Monetary Fund's Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva said on Sunday. "China faces a fork in the road — rely on the policies that have worked in the past, or reinvent itself for a new era of high-quality growth," Georgieva said in

remarks to a meeting of senior Chinese officials and executives from global companies.

Officials who spoke at the opening of the China Development Forum expressed confidence China would hit its economic targets, including growth of about 5% this year, and pledged further support for companies in strategically important sectors, an area Chinese President Xi Jinping has dubbed "new productive forces."

But those commitments stopped short of the more sweeping changes urged by the IMF. Georgieva said an analysis by the IMF showed a more consumer-centered policy mix could add \$3.5 trillion to China's economy over the next 15 years. If achieved, that boost would be equivalent to adding output equivalent to more twice the size of South Korea's economy.

To do that China would need to take "decisive" steps to complete unfinished housing stranded by bankrupt developers and to reduce risks from local government debt, the IMF chief said.

2,000 Earthquakes in a Day Hammer Fault Line Off Pacific Coast

Deep beneath the north Pacific Ocean, a slumbering giant awoke. A volcano

submerged under 4,800 meters of water off the coast of British Columbia set off 2,000 earthquakes in a single day earlier this month. Surprisingly, it raised no alarm.

The site, called the Endeavour, is a string of hydrothermal vents along the Juan de Fuca Ridge. About 240 kilometers west of Vancouver, it makes for especially thin crust on the ocean floor. When 800°C magma bubbled up to the surface, it sent seismographs reeling. The March 6 tremors were light-duty. Even though they jolted the fault line over 200 times per hour, they posed no threat to humans. Ocean Networks Canada (ONC) measured the strongest events at around 4.1 on the Richter scale. However, they noted the magma is likely adding new material to the ocean floor.

US Army Cutting 5 Percent of Jobs in Major Revamp to Prepare for Future Wars

The U.S. Army is slashing the size of its force by about 24,000, or almost 5%, and restructuring to be better able to fight the next major war, as the service struggles with recruiting shortfalls that made it impossible to bring in enough soldiers to fill all the jobs. The cuts will mainly be in already-empty posts — not actual soldiers — including in jobs related to counter-insurgency that swelled during the Iraq and Afghanistan wars but are not needed as much today. About 3,000 of the cuts would come from Army special operations forces.

At the same time, however, the plan will add about 7,500 troops in other critical missions, including air-defense and counterdrone units and five new task forces around the world with enhanced cyber, intelligence and long-range strike capabilities.

According to an Army document, the service is "significantly overstructured" and there aren't enough soldiers to fill existing units. The cuts, it said, are "spaces" not "faces" and the Army will not be asking soldiers to leave the force.

Instead, the decision reflects the reality that for years the Army hasn't been able to fill thousands of empty posts. While the Army as it's currently structured can have up to 494,000 soldiers, the total number of active-duty soldiers right now is about 445,000. Under the new plan, the goal is to bring in enough troops over the next five years to reach a level of 470,000.

The planned overhaul comes after two decades of war in Iraq and Afghanistan that forced the Army to quickly and dramatically expand in order to fill the brigades sent to the battlefront. That included a massive counter-insurgency mission to battle al-Qaida, the Taliban and the Islamic State group.

Over time the military's focus has shifted to great power competition from adversaries such as China and Russia, and threats from Iran and North Korea. And the war in Ukraine has shown the need for greater emphasis on air-defense systems and high-tech abilities both to use and counter airborne and sea-based drones.

Army leaders said they looked carefully across the board at all the service's job specialties in search of places to trim. And they examined the ongoing effort to modernize the Army, with new high-tech weapons, to determine where additional forces should be focused.

According to the plan, the Army will cut about 10,000 spaces for engineers and similar jobs that were tied to counter-insurgency missions. An additional 2,700 cuts will come from units that don't deploy often and can be trimmed, and 6,500 will come from various training and other posts.

There also will be about 10,000 posts cut from cavalry squadrons, Stryker brigade combat teams, infantry brigade combat teams and security force assistance brigades, which are used to train foreign forces. The changes represent a significant shift for the Army to prepare for large-scale combat operations against more sophisticated enemies. But they also underscore the steep recruiting challenges that all of the military services are facing.

In the last fiscal year, which ended Sept. 30, the Navy, Army and Air Force all failed to meet their recruitment goals, while the Marine Corps and the tiny Space Force met their targets. The Army brought in a bit more than 50,000 recruits, falling well short of the publicly stated "stretch goal" of 65,000.

The previous fiscal year, the Army also missed its enlistment goal by 15,000. That year the goal was 60,000.

In response, the service launched a sweeping overhaul of its recruiting last fall to focus more on young people who have spent time in college or are job hunting early in their careers. And it is forming a new professional force of recruiters, rather than relying on soldiers randomly assigned to the task.

In discussing the changes at the time, Army Secretary Christine Wormuth acknowledged that the service hasn't been recruiting well "for many more years than one would think from just looking at the headlines in the last 18 months." The service, she said, hasn't met its annual goal for new enlistment contracts since 2014.

China to Send Ships as Taiwan Tensions Rise

China's coast guard said on Sunday it will strengthen its law enforcement activities and carry out regular patrols around a small group of Taiwanese-controlled islands off the Chinese coast as tensions rise over the deaths of two Chinese nationals. Taiwan on Thursday defended the actions of its coast guard after two people on a Chinese speedboat, which got too close to a frontline Taiwanese island, died when their boat overturned while trying to flee a coast guard ship. Two others survived. Taiwan, which China claims as its own territory, has complained in recent years about Chinese fishing boats and other vessels operating in Taiwan-controlled waters, especially around the Kinmen and Matsu islands which sit a short distance from China's coast.

China has condemned Taiwan's actions and labeled the incident near Kinmen's Beiding islet "wicked."

China's coast guard said in a short statement it will strengthen its maritime law enforcement forces and carry out regular law enforcement patrols and inspections in the waters around Kinmen and Xiamen, one of the Chinese cities Kinmen faces.

This is to "further maintain the order of operations in the relevant waters and safeguard the safety of fishermen's lives and property," it added. Late on Saturday, China's Taiwan Affairs Office said the deaths had caused "strong indignation" in China, but that there were no off limits waters.

"Fishermen on both sides of the Taiwan Strait have been operating in traditional fishing grounds in the Xiamen-Kinmen maritime area since ancient times, and there is no such thing as 'prohibited or restricted waters'," it said.

China's government had goodwill towards Taiwan's people, but will never tolerate Taiwan's disregard for the safety of Chinese fishermen, the office added.

Taiwan's China-policy making Mainland Affairs Council said Taiwanese forces will continue to enforce the rules on banning unauthorized Chinese access to Taiwan's waters around Kinmen, but that accusations from China of "rough expulsions" were untrue.

However, ships that carry no name, have no certification or port registration, carry out "continuous intrusions," and make dangerous moves when trying to flee lead to "unfortunate incidents" nobody wants to see, it added.

Kinmen, along with Matsu, has been controlled by Taipei since the end of the Chinese civil war in 1949, when the defeated Republic of China government fled to Taiwan after losing to Mao Zedong's communists who set up the People's Republic of China. Kinmen was the site of frequent fighting during the height of the Cold War but is today a popular tourist destination, though many of the islets which are part of the island group are heavily fortified by Taiwan's military and off limits to civilians.

Taiwan, whose government rejects Beijing's sovereignty claims, says China has been using so-called grey-zone warfare, which entails using irregular tactics to exhaust a foe without actually resorting to open combat, including sending civilian ships into or close by Taiwanese waters.

Separately on Saturday, a group of low-level Chinese officials from Shanghai arrived in Taipei to attend the city's traditional Lantern Festival at the city government's invitation.

However, Taipei Mayor Chiang Wan-an told reporters he would not meet the group, led by Xu Hao, head of the liaison department of the Taiwan Affairs Office's Shanghai branch.

Last year, a deputy chief of the office's Shanghai branch went to Taipei for the same event, and was met by noisy protests at the airport.

Ontario earthquake: Rancho Cucamonga hit by 3.8 magnitude quake, felt in other parts of California

A3.8 magnitude <u>earthquake</u> struck Southern <u>California</u> near San Bernardino

County on Thursday night, as reported by the United States Geological Survey. San Diego California earthquake: 15 quakes in 30 minutes shake terrified people from beds

A series of <u>earthquakes</u> including one with a 4.8 Magnitude has rocked South West US near the border between <u>California</u> and <u>Mexico</u> leaving people's houses shaking.

Residents reported decorations falling from the walls and breaking as the quake was felt across the area. According to United States Geological Survey (USGS) 15 earthquakes have so far hit in the space of an hour. People from as far as San Diego to Yuma, Arizona, reported feeling the earth shake.

The earthquake was assessed as 4.8 on the Earthquake Magnitude Scale. According to Michigan Tech, around 500,000 earthquakes of this scale happen accross the world each year. Describing quakes from 2.5 to 5.4 on the scale, their website reads: "Often felt, but only causes minor damage."

Magnitude 5.7 Earthquake Strikes Hawaii's Big Island

A magnitude 5.7 earthquake struck the world's largest active volcano on Friday — Mauna Loa on the Big Island of Hawaii — knocking items off shelves and cutting power in a nearby town but not immediately prompting reports of serious damage. The earthquake, which didn't cause a tsunami and which the U.S. Geological Survey initially reported as magnitude 6.3, was

centered on Mauna Loa's southern flank at a depth of 23 miles, 1.3 miles southwest of Pahala.

"It shook us bad to where it wobbled some knees a little bit," said Derek Nelson, the manager of the Kona Canoe Club restaurant in the oceanside community of Kona, on the island's western side. "It shook all the windows in the village." There was a power outage affecting about 300 customers in Naalehu that appeared to be related to the earthquake, said Darren Pai, spokesperson for Hawaiian Electric Company.

The earthquake struck after 10 a.m. local time, less than two hours before an unrelated quake with a preliminary magnitude of 4.6 shook Southern California.

Mauna Loa last erupted in late 2022. It's one of five volcanoes that make up the Big Island, which is the southernmost in the Hawaiian archipelago.

Earthquakes can occur in Hawaii for a variety of reasons, including magma moving under the surface. In Friday's case, the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory said the likely cause was the weight of the Hawaiian Islands bending and stressing the Earth's crust and upper mantle.

That's what caused a magnitude 6.9 earthquake that struck off Kiholo Bay on the Big Island's northwest coast in 2006. That temblor damaged roads and buildings and knocked out power as far away as Honolulu, on the island of Oahu, about 200 miles to the north.

Helen Janiszewski, an assistant professor in the University of Hawaii at Manoa's Department of Earth Sciences, said the Hawaiian Islands lie on the Pacific oceanic tectonic plate and have some of the world's biggest volcanoes.

"So there's a huge amount of mass of rock associated with the islands and because of that, it's actually enough to slightly displace the Pacific oceanic plate beneath the islands," she said. "And that force causes earthquakes sometimes."

4.6-Magnitude Earthquake Strikes Southern California

The authorities said there were no immediate reports of significant damage from the quake, one of several that struck near Malibu, Calif., near Los Angeles.

An earthquake centered several miles northwest of Malibu, Calif., rattled residents across the Los Angeles area on Friday afternoon, sparking a typical flurry of posts on social media, though the authorities said no major damage or injuries had been reported.

The quake happened at 1:47 p.m. local time and had a <u>preliminary magnitude of 4.6</u>, according to the United States Geological Survey. It was followed by <u>several smaller aftershocks</u>.

Residents across the county reported feeling a shake that lasted for about 10 seconds, with plates clinking in cupboards and plants swaying slightly.

Some residents, however, were surprised to learn of the earthquake and said they had not felt anything.

No significant damage was reported in the city of Los Angeles, according to Capt. Erik Scott, a spokesman for the Los Angeles Fire Department. Mr. Scott said the agency was in what it refers to as "earthquake mode."

"When the ground shakes in the city of L.A., the L.A.F.D. enters this mode and firefighters from all 106 fire stations provide a complete survey of 470 square miles in greater Los Angeles to ensure safety," he said.

Schools within the Los Angeles Unified School District sent out automated calls noting that students had remained in their classes.

The Russian Foreign Ministry has ordered Israel's Ambassador to Russia, Simona Halperin, to appear Monday night for a reprimand for "inappropriate statements."

Russia is present in the Middle East and it has interests there, and we also are not secondary players in the region. As a result of this there was communication, there is communication, and there will be communication between the countries in the future."

5.1 magnitude earthquake near Oklahoma City felt in 5 states, USGS says

The Oklahoma City area felt a magnitude 5.1 earthquake late Friday followed by a series of aftershocks.

Around 11:24 p.m. local time, the earthquake struck near Prague, about 63 miles east of Oklahoma City, according to the <u>Oklahoma Geological Survey</u>. It had a depth just under 2 miles. A series of smaller earthquakes, as large as 3.5 magnitude, were felt in the area.

State Seismologist Jake Walter said he expected more aftershocks to continue in the coming days. The 5.1-earthquake happened on the same fault as a <u>2011</u> <u>earthquake in Prague that was a magnitude 5.7</u>, he said on <u>social media</u>.

Oklahoma earthquakes: Oklahoma City-area hit by 4.1-magnitude earthquake Saturday, one of several in Oklahoma

The <u>U.S. Geological Survey indicated</u> the earthquake was felt across much of Oklahoma, including in Oklahoma City and Tulsa, and across state lines in Kansas, Missouri, Arkansas and parts of Texas. The <u>USGS said</u> earthquakes east of the Rockies, while less frequent than in the West, are typically felt over larger areas. In mid-January, the Oklahoma City area <u>experienced a 4.1 earthquake</u>, with a depth of 4.1 miles, amid a series of quakes along a fault line near the Northeast Edmond Gas and Oil Field.

The state has seen an uptick in earthquakes in recent years, many of which have derived from human activity, including oil and natural gas production.

Iran seeks to produce 20,000 megawatts of nuclear energy by 2041. Iran has one nuclear power plant at its southern port of Bushehr that went online in 2011 with help from Russia, but also several underground nuclear facilities.

In 2019, Iran and Russia <u>inaugurated a new phase</u> of construction for a second reactor at Bushehr.

In 2022, <u>Iran began construction</u> on a new nuclear power plant in the country's southwest. At the time, it was reported that the 300-megawatt plant, known as Karoon, would take eight years to build and cost around \$2 billion.

IRNA quoted Mohammad Eslami, the head of Iran's atomic agency, as saying on Thursday it will take up to nine years to complete the new plants.

3 American troops killed, 25 injured in attack on Jordan base near Syria border

Biden blasts 'radical Iran-backed militant groups' after deadly drone attack on US personnel

Three U.S. service members were killed and at least 25 others were injured in a drone attack on an outpost in northeast Jordan near the Syrian border, <u>U.S.</u> Central Command confirmed on Sunday.

But a senior U.S. defense official told Fox News the injury toll could rise to higher than 25 Americans. NATO WITHDRAWS FROM COLD WAR-ERA SECURITY TREATY AFTER RUSSIAN EXIT

BRUSSELS (AP) – NATO on Tuesday announced the formal suspension of a key Cold War-era security treaty in response to Russia's pullout from the deal just hours earlier. The alliance also said its members who signed the treaty are now freezing their participation in the pact.

Most of NATO's 31 allies have signed the Treaty of Conventional Armed Forces in Europe, which was aimed at preventing Cold War rivals from massing forces at or near mutual borders. It was signed in November 1990, but not fully ratified until two years later.

NATO said its action was required because "a situation whereby Allied State Parties abide by the Treaty, while Russia does not, would be unsustainable."

Earlier in the day, Moscow said it had finalized its withdrawal from the treaty, also known as CFE. The long-expected move came after both houses of the Russian parliament approved a bill

proposed by President Vladimir Putin denouncing the CFE. Putin signed that bill it into force in May this year

The treaty was one of several major Cold War-era treaties involving Russia and the United States that ceased to be in force in recent years. Russia suspended its participation in 2007, and in 2015 announced its intention to completely withdraw from the agreement.

In February 2022, Moscow invaded Ukraine, sending hundreds of thousands of Russian troops into the neighboring country, which also shares a border with NATO members Poland, Slovakia, Romania and Hungary

Russia's Foreign Ministry said the process of the formal withdrawal from the treaty has been completed, without elaborating what that entailed. It blamed the U.S. and its allies for the withdrawal and the West's allegedly "destructive position" on the treaty.

"We left the door open for a dialogue on ways to restore the viability of conventional arms control in Europe," it said. "However, our opponents did not take advantage of this opportunity."

The statement further said that "even the formal preservation" of the treaty has become "unacceptable from the point of view of Russia's fundamental security interests," citing developments in Ukraine and NATO's recent expansion.

In Brussels, NATO said that its allies who had signed on "intend to suspend the operation of the CFE Treaty for as long as necessary, in accordance with their rights under international law." The alliance underlined that its members remain committed "to reduce military risk, and prevent misperceptions and conflicts."

NATO said that its members will continue to "consult on and assess the implications of the current security environment and its impact on the security" of the alliance.

Diaa Rashwan, Chairman of Egypt's State Information Service, warned on Monday that a move by Israel to capture the Philadelphi Corridor along the Gaza-Egypt border may lead to a "severe and serious" threat to the relations between the two countries.

Approximately a week ago the *Wall Street Journal* reported that Israel notified Egypt of intentions to begin a military operation along the corridor.

The military operation would likely include removing Gazan officials from crossing points and placing Israeli forces along the border area.

NEW ERUPTION ON THE REYKJANES PENINSULA

A volcanic eruption started on Sunday, January 14, near Grindavík on the Reykjanes Peninsula. The town had previously been evacuated, and people were not in danger. <u>View current updates here</u>

On average, a volcano erupts in Iceland erupts every five years. Since 2021, however, the frequency has been closer to every 12 months! The area broadly known as Fagradalsfjall, some 35km from the capital Reykjavík, flared to life after a series of earthquakes on the Reykjanes Peninsula. The three eruptions - some consider one single eruption with months-long pauses - mark the beginning of a new geological era on the southwestern peninsula, which has been dormant for the past 800 years.

Iran seizes oil tanker linked to crisis between US and Tehran, military officials confirm

The US has been fending off Iran-backed terrorists in the region for weeks

Iranian forces have seized an oil tanker in the Gulf of Oman, two U.S. military officials confirmed to Fox News on Thursday.

The seized vessel, previously known as the Suez Rajan, was once at the center of another dispute between the U.S. and Iran that ultimately saw the U.S. seize over 1 million barrels of Iranian crude oil. Armed Iranian soldiers reportedly boarded the vessel Thursday morning.

The U.S. and other Western navies have been combating attacks from Iran-backed Houthi rebels in Yemen in the Red Sea for weeks, but Iran itself had not taken direct action beyond <u>sending one of its naval vessels</u> to the region. The Houthis had been a State Department designated foreign terrorist organization until February 2021, when the designation was revoked by the Biden administration.

The U.S. Navy has shot down numerous missiles and drones fired by Houthi rebels. U.S. Navy helicopters also fired on and sank multiple Houthi small boats as they attempted to hijack a trade vessel last month.

Iranian warship 'enters Red Sea' amid ongoing Houthi attacks on merchant shipping

Iran's Alborz warship has entered the Red Sea through the strategic Bab el-Mandeb strait, the semi-official Tasnim news agency reported Monday, amid heightened tensions in the globally important strategic waterway.

The report comes against the backdrop of repeated missile and drone attacks against Israel from Houthi rebels in Yemen, and Houthi attacks on merchant shipping in the critical international waterway.

On Sunday, US Navy helicopters from the USS Eisenhower carrier strike group fired on Houthi rebels who were attempting to board a Maersk cargo ship off Yemen, with the Houthis reporting 10 fighters dead or missing.

Japan lowers its tsunami warning but still tells people not to go home after a series of earthquakes

TOKYO (AP) — Japan dropped its highest-level tsunami alert, issued following a series of major earthquakes on Monday, but told residents of coastal areas not to return to their homes as deadly waves could still come. The quakes, the largest of which had a magnitude of 7.6, started a fire and collapsed buildings on the west coast of Japan's main island, Honshu. It was unclear how many people might have been killed or hurt.

The Japan Meteorological Agency reported more than a dozen quakes in the Japan Sea off the coast of Ishikawa and nearby prefectures shortly after 4 p.m.

At least six homes were damaged by the quakes, with people trapped inside, government spokesman Yoshimasa Hayashi

said. A fire broke out in Wajima city, Ishikawa Prefecture, and electricity was out for more than 30,000 households, he said.

The agency initially issued a major tsunami warning for Ishikawa and lower-level tsunami warnings or advisories for the rest of the western coast of the island of Honshu, as well as the northernmost of its main islands, Hokkaido.

The warning was downgraded to a regular tsunami several hours later, meaning the waters could still reach up to 3 meters (10 feet). Aftershocks could also slam the same area over the next few days, it said.

Japanese public broadcaster NHK TV initially warned torrents of water could reach as high as 5 meters (16.5 feet).

NHK said the tsunami waves could keep returning, and warnings were continuing to be aired hours after the initial alert. Several aftershocks also rocked the region.

Hayashi stressed that it was critical for people in coastal areas to get away from the oncoming tsunami.

"Every minute counts. Please evacuate to a safe area immediately," he said.

People returning to get their wallets and other belongings have been known to be swept away and drowned even hours after the first evacuation warning. People were evacuated to stadiums, where they will likely have to stay for a few days. Hayashi said no reports of deaths or injuries had been confirmed from the quakes, saying the situation was still unclear. Japan's military was taking part in the rescue efforts, he said.

Japanese media footage showed people running through the streets, and red smoke spewing from a fire in a residential neighborhood. Photos showed a crowd of people, including a woman with a baby on her back, standing by huge cracks that had ripped through the pavement.

Some people sustained minor injuries when they tripped and fell while fleeing, or objects fell off shelves and hit them, according to NHK.

Bullet trains in the area were halted, although some parts of the service were restored by evening. Parts of the highway were also closed, and water pipes had burst, according to NHK.

Some cell phone services in the region weren't working.

The Meteorological Agency said in a nationally broadcast news conference that more major quakes could hit the area over the next week, especially in the next two or three days.

More than a dozen strong quakes had been detected in the region, with risks of setting off landslides and houses collapsing, according to the agency.

Takashi Wakabayashi, a worker at a convenience store in Ishikawa Prefecture, said some items had tumbled from the shelves, but the biggest problem was the huge crowd of people who had shown up to stock up on bottled water, rice balls and bread.

"We have customers at three times the level of usual," he said. Tsunami warnings were also issued for parts of North Korea and Russia.

The Japanese government has set up a special emergency center to gather information on the quakes and tsunami and relay them speedily to residents to ensure safety, Prime Minister Fumio Kishida told reporters.

Japan is an extremely quake-prone nation. In March 2011, a major quake and tsunami caused meltdowns at a nuclear plant.

The latest warning was the first time since the 2011 disaster that a tsunami warning of this magnitude was issued.

Government spokesman Hayashi told reporters that nuclear plants in the affected area had not reported any irregularities on Monday. Nuclear regulators said no rises in radiation levels were detected at the monitoring posts in the region.

MASSIVE EARTHQUAKE KILLS OVER 2,400 IN NORTHWEST AFGHANISTAN

Afghanistan was struck by its deadliest earthquake in years on Sunday, with more than 2,400 casualties reported at last count from the northwestern city of Herat and its surrounding province.

The U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) <u>rated</u> the quake at magnitude 6.3 and said its epicenter was in the rural district of Zindajan, about 20 miles northwest of Herat.

The U.N. Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) said "one hundred percent of homes are estimated to have been completely destroyed" in Zindajan. Herat itself suffered relatively minor damage to its <u>ancient minarets</u>. Eyewitnesses said one reason the disaster response was slow for rural communities was that Herat was left largely intact and, since cellphone service was out, rescuers in Herat did not immediately realize how badly damaged the surrounding villages were.

The Taliban regime struggled to produce solid estimates of how many people were killed, or even how many people live in Zindajan, since its population includes a large number of displaced persons.

Reuters <u>explained</u> on Monday that houses in earthquake-prone Afghanistan, which straddles at least two active fault lines, are not really built to handle tremors:

The Herat region has not been a hotbed of seismic activity until now, so the buildings and residents were especially unprepared for Sunday's powerful quake. "Nobody was prepared," a rescue worker with CARE Afghanistan told the Washington Post.

Another rescue worker said many of the houses struck by the quake collapsed within seconds, trapping people who were in the process of running for the exits.

Afghanistan's independent Tolo News reported the Naib Rafi village in Zindajan was "destroyed completely," and roughly 80 percent of its population was killed. "The people here are stranded under wreckage. The people of other districts came here to help. All the people have been eliminated. Three shepherds were working here while the [earthquake] destroyed them. When they came back here, no one was alive, they were all under ruins," a Zindajan resident told Tolo News.

A spokesman for the Afghan Ministry of Disaster Management <u>rattled off</u> a list of 13 villages largely or completely destroyed by the earthquake, along with a large quantity of livestock, which is bad news for a country teetering on the verge of mass starvation.

The death toll was doubtless exacerbated by the general incompetence of the Taliban regime, and the shortage of humanitarian funding as its barbaric practices have <u>driven</u> international donors away.

"While there was still hope, more people were being pulled from ruined buildings dead than alive on Monday. Afghanistan's hospitals, already over-stretched and severely underequipped since in the wake of the Taliban's chaotic seizure of the country, were quickly overwhelmed," CBS News reported.

A spokesman for Doctors Without Borders (RSF) said on Monday that many of the quake victims treated at the Herat Regional Hospital "do not have homes to return to," so they are "remaining in the hospital while authorities look for alternative places for them to stay." According to the United Nations, both the injured survivors and the dead include a large number of women and children.

"The Taliban government has said quake survivors are in urgent need of food, drinking water, medicine, clothes and tents for shelter. Several aid agencies have dispatched help, including the Afghan Red Cross Society, MSF, World Food Program and Unicef. But the agencies say the cash-strapped country needs more aid," the BBC wrote on Monday.
